ASSISTANT PROFESSOR POSITION

The Department of Applied Physiology and Kinesiology at the University of Florida (www.hhp.ufl.edu/apk) invites applications and nominations for a physiologist at the rank of Assistant Professor. The Department, which enrolls about 650 students (570 undergraduate, 80 graduate) consists of 17 full-time faculty. It is housed in state-of-the-art research facilities and lecture halls. With an outstanding faculty and staff, the Department is poised to become one of the premier Applied Physiology and Kinesiology Departments in the United States.

Candidates must possess an earned doctorate in physiology/biophysics, exercise physiology, or another appropriately related field. The successful candidate must have a distinguished record of scholarly accomplishments, success or promise in obtaining extramural funding for research, and excellent teaching skills. It is highly desirable that candidates have research interests complimenting existing faculty in the areas of skeletal muscle, cardiovascular physiology or related areas. Applicants should also have outstanding communication skills along with a commitment to integrity, academic excellence, and professional service.

This is a 9-month tenure accruing position. The application deadline is January 15, 2008.
